

What is Global Studies?







Why a degree in Global Studies? (I)

 GS deals with the analysis of <u>global challenges</u> that affect humanity as a whole: climate change, migrations, economic crisis, war and violence, poverty, pandemics, structures of domination and injustice, racism, gender discrimination, etc.

- Because . . . gradually, a genuine global society for the first time in History.
- And you will learn about those global challenges by exchanging perspectives with students from all over the world in an internationalized classroom . . . in a "glocal" city!!!



Why a degree in Global Studies? (II)

- The rising number of profound, global challenges can only be effectively managed if addressed in a coordinated manner by relevant local, national, regional and global actors.
- So, essential to take into account the <u>local points of view</u> (i.e. religion, philosophy, geography, art, literature, science, ideology, identity, history, politics, etc.), through which each community explains itself and tries to cope with these challenges.
- The need for <u>transdisciplinary</u> study programmes aimed at describing, exploring, analyzing, and understanding globalization and global phenomena.

What will students do afterwards?



- Future graduates will not be mere analysts of the present, but active designers of the future ready to cope with existing and emerging global challenges.

 - national, regional, and local governments (Adrià Guevara: <u>Regidor [city</u> <u>councillor]</u>, Catalonia)
 - international organizations (Manuela García: <u>campaign analyst</u>, OXFAM-INTERMÓN)
 - multinational corporations, thinks tanks (Musa Obed: <u>think-tank director</u> <u>general</u>, *Puerta de África*)
 - **communication departments** (Josep M. Folch: <u>communications officer & project</u> <u>manager</u>, research firm in Brussels)
 - global mass media, political parties,
 - Research/data analysis institutions/ companies (Peter Berna: <u>data analyst</u>, IQVIA)
 - non-governmental organizations (NGOs)
 - **businesses with connections abroad** (Pablo Tosto: <u>internationalization project</u> <u>manager</u>, start-up firms related to sustainability)

- International students (EU and non-EU).
- All compulsory courses will be conducted in English.
- Most electives will be offered in English.
- Some electives may be taught in Catalan or Spanish . . .
- . . . so as to allow students to complete the program entirely in English, or to combine courses in more than one language.
- Compulsory: At least, 18 ECTS of Arabic, Chinese, French or Russian (or Spanish for non Spanish-speaking students).
- International faculty from 5 departments (Communication, Economics, Humanities, Law and Politics), under the coordination of the Faculty of Humanities.



- An internationalized classroom with EU and non-EU students and faculty.




During your studies, you will not be alone

- And the Academic Secretariat (Secretaria de la Facultat), helping you up with information about your studies, how to do the different academic procedures, where you can consult your academic records, etc.




Where are we? Ciutadella campus
